HIGH LIGHTS

- ▶ The Index of Industrial Production (IIP) for the month of March 2023 for the textile Sector declined by 7.6% as compared to march 2022.
- ▶ There has been a cumulative fall of 8.7% in Textile Sector during April - March 2022-23 over the corresponding period of 2021-2022.
- ▶ The Index of Industrial Production for wearing apparel of March 2023 dropped by 33% and a fall of 7.4% during the period April - March 2022 -2023 over the corresponding period of the previous year.

The Statement below gives the Quick Estimates of growth rate of the Index of Industrial Production (II) at 2 digit level of the National Industrial Classification (NIC - 2008) for the period of April -March 2022-2023, along with the cumulative growth rates over corresponding period of the previous year:
